



NYS AFCSE FCCLA Advisor of the Year Award

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The FCCLA Advisor of the Year Award recognizes an individual who has made a significant contribution as an advisor to FCCLA (Family, Community and Career Leaders of America) and as a member of NYS AFCSE.

Any member of NYS AFCSE may nominate a candidate for the NYS AFCSE / FCCLA Advisor of the Year Award. There is no limit on the number of nominees from each local area. The following nomination form may be duplicated.

Presentation

The Award for NYS AFCSE / FCCLA Advisor of the Year will be presented in the fall of each year and be recognized at the annual NYS FCCLA State Conference. In even years, these awards will be presented at the State Convention Awards Banquet, including all winners from the current and previous year. The winner will receive a framed certificate and an engraved gift. In the odd years, the presentation will be made at an appropriate event such as the FCCLA Summer Leadership Training.

Criteria for Award

The recipient must:

- be a current FCCLA advisor, with an active chapter
- have completed a project with the chapter related to one of the many National FCCLA Programs
- have completed a service-learning project with the chapter
- be a current member of NYS AFCSE
- have made a significant contribution to NYS AFCSE

Nomination Procedure

1. The Awards Chairperson shall request nominations through a winter notice to Area Coordinators.
2. The nominations form and five copies are to be sent to the NYS AFCSE Awards Chairperson, postmarked no later than April 1.
3. Any NYS AFCSE member can make a nomination for the NYS AFCSE / FCCLA Advisor of the Year Award by submitting a completed nomination form to the State Awards Chairperson by the due date.
